Philippines is the 7th largest mango producer in the world in 2007. In 2010 it became the 9th largest mango producer.

production reached 967 thousand metric tons
95% of which is domestically consumed.

Challenges of conventional mango growing

**Conventional growers are generally threatened by:
climate change, environmental and health issues and the resulting high economic costs of farm input**

Preda response: Assistance to small family-based mango growers are the target of the Preda Fair Trade Initiative.

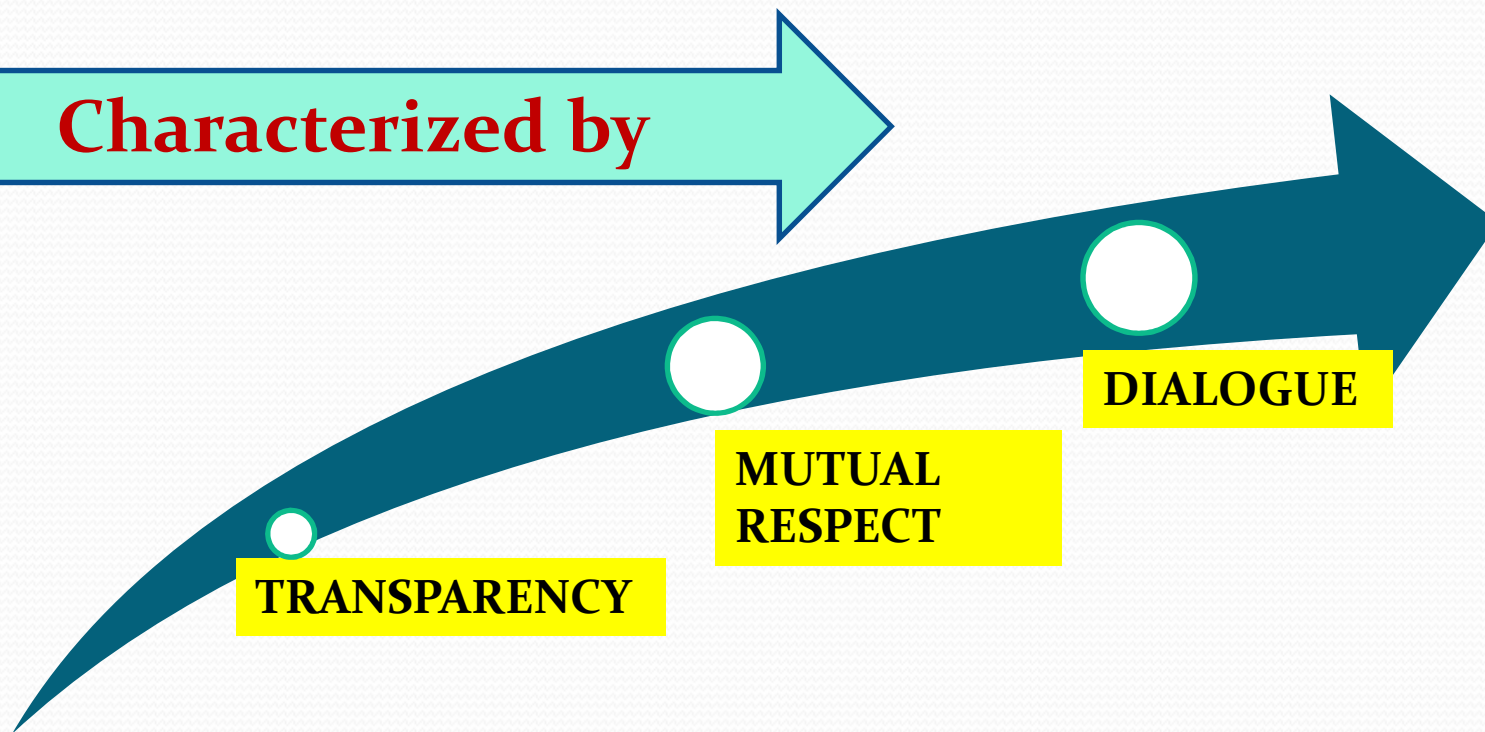
- ✓ Individual families who has mango trees in their own farm land

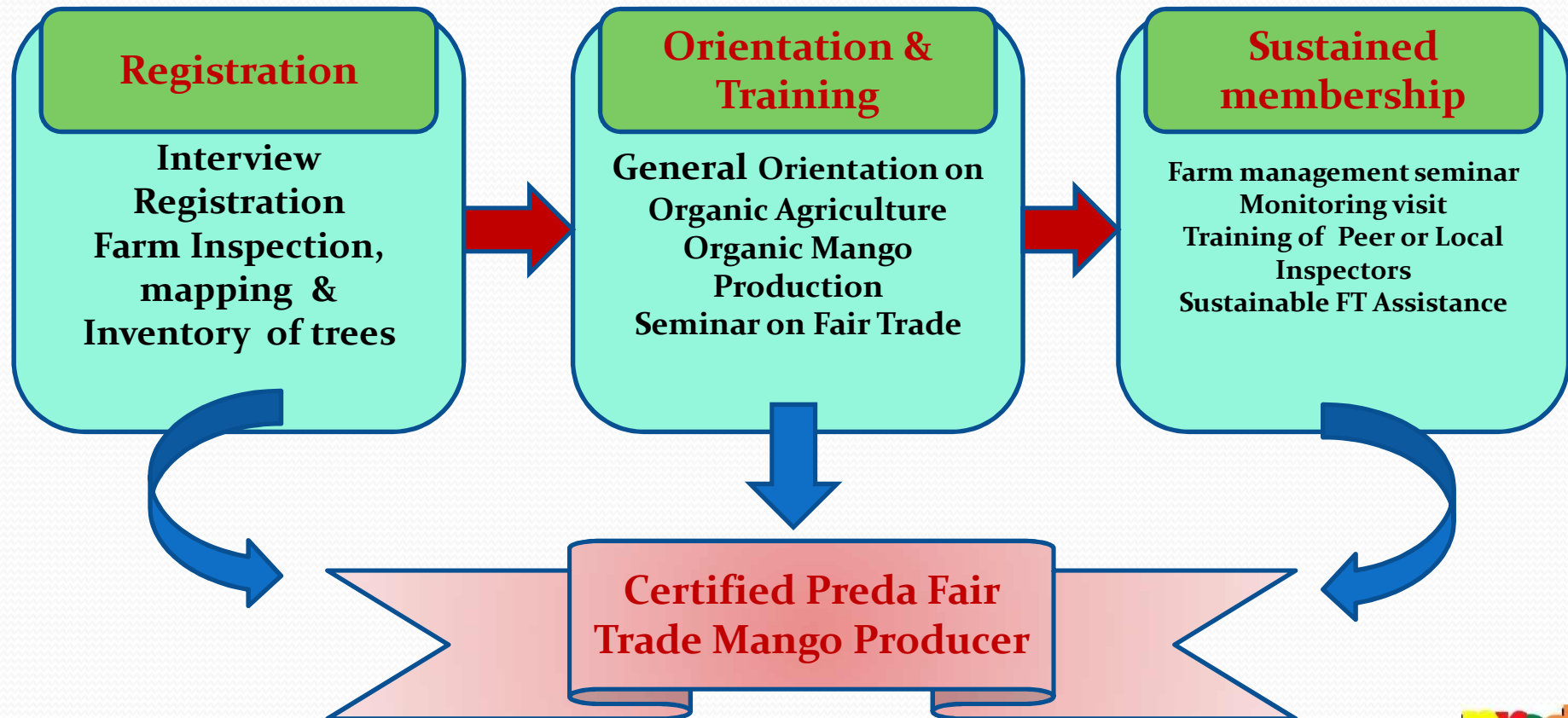

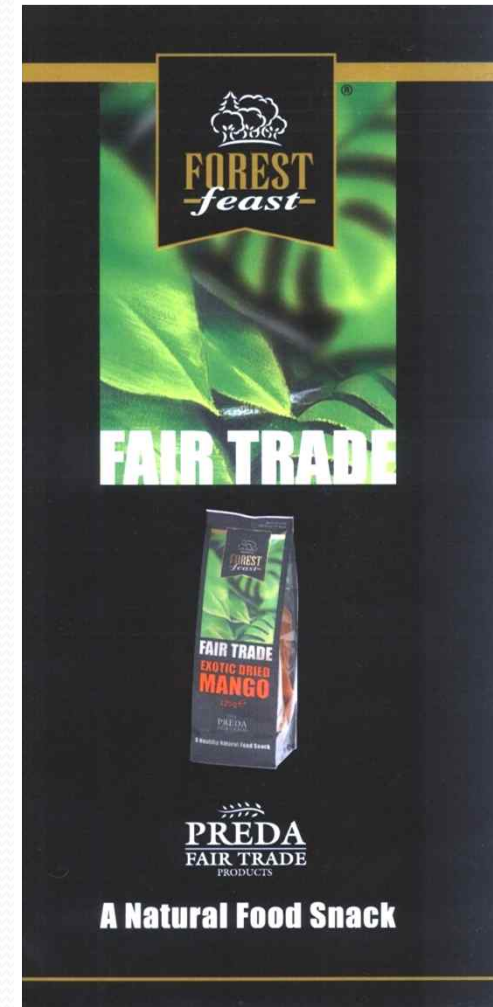

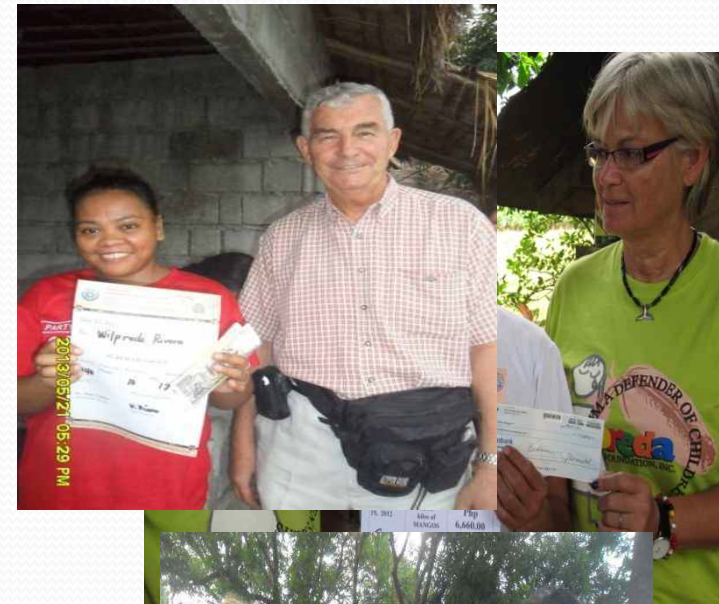

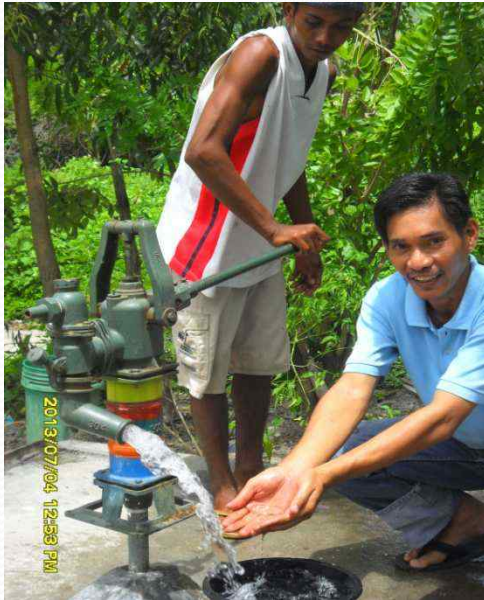
